# Better Family Life, Inc.

\$3,500

To support youth workshops in Black Masking Indian and Stilt Dancing Masquerade culture and history.

#### Black Men of Labor, Inc.

\$3,500

To support a second-line parade at the 30<sup>th</sup> annual Black Men of Labor, Inc., Noir Experience Festival.

Creole Wild West \$3,500

To support Creole Wild West's youth education programs, including at least 40 free sessions of onsite education in Central City for at least 30 children on Saturday afternoons in Mardi Gras Indian Culture.
